October is the Rotary month of Economic Community Development

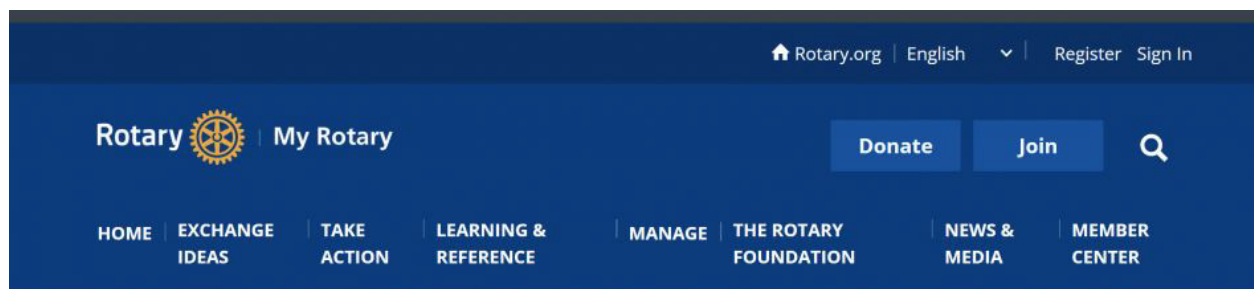


RAGCED has the resources and the training available to help people lift themselves out of poverty.

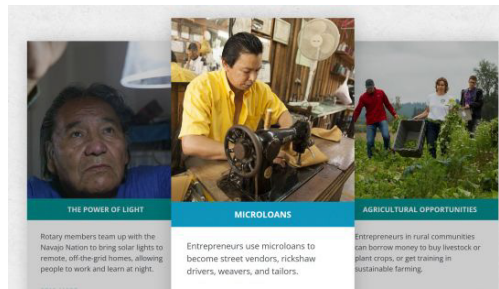
